









Dalia Canora Design

n developing her plan for a serene and comfortable guest bedroom, Dalia Canora started with a fabric that she happened upon by chance at a local design store. She ultimately used the textile for the room's draperies, and it became the basis for a dreamy palette of subtle pastels. The room's almost ethereal glow is due in no small part to the palest blush pink of the window panels that guided Canora's color choice for three walls. The soft shade of taupe in the fabric inspired both her selection of Thibaut paper on the focal wall and the paint for the twin antique beds that she dressed in new linens with an heirloom, vintage delicacy. An ultra-soft, deeply piled shag rug enhances the room's comfort factor even further. To finish the look, the designer commissioned a pair of landscapes from a California painter who often shows her work locally. "I sent her a board with small cutouts of all the fabrics, wall colors and floor coverings," she notes, "and the artist took off from there." -JO
